In addition to my public safety career, I have an extensive background in banking, finance, and business management, having served as a City President of a community bank and Branch Manager/Personal Banker. Those experiences allowed me to lead successful teams, develop business strategies, oversee budgets and operations, coach employees, build customer relationships, and promote responsible financial management. Those leadership experiences continue to serve me well today in managing municipal operations, working collaboratively with stakeholders, and making sound, objective decisions.

Beyond my professional career, I have remained committed to serving the code enforcement profession through active participation in GACE. I believe our Association is strongest when we lead with professionalism, consistency, integrity, and respect for every member.
